## 6.0 BUSINESS ARISING

## 6.1 Personnel COVID-19 Immunization Policy

The Health Unit's Personnel COVID-19 Immunization Policy – OP-POL-9, and related procedure (Personnel COVID-19 Immunization – 6-1), were revised to include Board of Health members under the policy and procedure and were shared with Board members for awareness and required follow-up action, as noted in the policy and procedure.

## 7.0 REPORT OF THE MEDICAL OFFICER OF HEALTH

The Report of the Medical Officer of Health dated November 24, 2021, was presented to the Board of Health for information purposes.

An additional verbal update from the Medical Officer of Health was also provided. The report included the following:

- The Director of Immunization Strategy is scheduled to retire within the next few days and the Health Unit is indebted to them for the tireless work that has been accomplished behind the scenes to organize and implement one of the largest immunization campaigns in history; the work accomplished has been truly amazing and has literally saved lives
- Locally, case rates have been low, but an increase is anticipated with the significant increase in cases in surrounding areas
- The vaccination program continues along with encouraging the continued use of public health measures to curb the spread of the virus
- The public is also encouraged to stay within the legal limits to gather, and to do a personal risk assessment before participating in social gatherings
- Things to consider would be the size of the gathering and if those attending are fully vaccinated
- The youth vaccine for the 5-11 age group has been approved by Health Canada and the National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI)
- The Health Unit has received a supply of the youth vaccine and will begin administering November 25 at youth vaccine clinics; regular immunization clinics will continue as well
- The Health Unit is collaborating with many partners across the entire district to get as many youths vaccinated as soon as possible
- Studies are underway for the development of a vaccine for the 6-month to 4-year-old age group; applications by the drug companies are not expected until the new year
- There are no COVID-19 patients in hospital in the district at present
- The majority of those that have been hospitalized are unvaccinated or partially vaccinated individuals
- Since June 1 of this year, less than 4% of fully vaccinated individuals end up in the hospital and less than 1% end up in ICU
- Vaccination has contributed to less serious illness in outbreaks within the vulnerable population group

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- The Health Unit's website has credible information and resources regarding COVID-19 and the vaccines for anyone looking for more information
- With waning immunity, booster doses are being provided to the vulnerable population
