Enhanced 18 month well-baby visits:

Percentage of the annual number of visits to family physicians or paediatricians for services identified as fee-for-service Ontario Health Insurance Plan (OHIP) claims for Enhanced 18 Month Well-Baby Visits (EWBV) among the population of children aged 12 to 24 months with a valid health card during the corresponding calendar year.

Children seen at a community health centre (CHC) are excluded from this measure as CHC physicians do not submit billing claims to OHIP. CHCs in the Health Unit region include the West Nipissing Community Health Centre and the North Bay Nurse Practitioner Led-Clinic.

Data sources:

Enhanced 18 month well-baby visits:

Ontario Medical Services Data [2011-2015], Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care, IntelliHEALTH Ontario, Date extracted: [April 19, 2018].

Population estimates:

Ontario Registered Persons Database [2011-2015], Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care, IntelliHEALTH ONTARIO, Date extracted: [April 19, 2018].

Confidence intervals:

Confidence intervals (CI) and variances were estimated using the poisson distribution in STATA IC/14.2 (2014) for all regions.

Interpretation of a significant difference:

A statistic interpreted as 'significantly different' from another is an estimate found to be statistically meaningful; the difference is unlikely due to chance. Error ranges noted in tables within this report illustrate 95% confidence intervals. If there is no overlap in range between confidence intervals, the difference can be described as statistically significant.

Overall Trends

In 2015, about one of every two children aged 12 to 24 months in the Health Unit region attended an enhanced 18 month well-baby visit. This rate is comparable to Ontario children and significantly higher compared to the North East LHIN region where one of every three children attended an enhanced 18 month well-baby visit. Percentages of children aged 12 to 24 months who have attended an enhanced 18 month well-baby visit have increased significantly in all three regions. 

By Geography

The percentages for the West & North Nipissing Region do not include children serviced by the West Nipissing Community Health Centre, likely producing an underestimate of the percentage of children aged 12 to 24 months who were seen at an enhanced 18 month well-baby visit within that region. Please interpret percentages and trends for that region with caution.

In 2015, between four and five children in East Nipissing and North East Parry Sound attended enhanced 18 month well-baby visits, significantly lower compared to between five and six children in Ontario. The percentage of enhanced 18 month well-baby visits among children aged 12 to 24 months increased across all regions between 2011 and 2015, with the exception of the West & North Nipissing region where the percentage appears stable (Figure 1 & Table 1). 

Trends by Sex

Between 2011 and 2014, the percentage of 12 to 24 month olds in the Health Unit region who attended well-baby visits has generally been lower compared to children in the same age group in Ontario, regardless of their sex (Figure 2 & Table 2). In 2015, between four to five male children aged between 12 and 24 months in the Health Unit region attended an enhanced 18 month well-baby visit, significantly lower compared to between five to six male children in Ontario. This difference between regions among boys does not exist for years prior to 2015 (i.e., 2011 – 2014), and may not signify a trend.


