

# The SickKids Vaccine Confidence Support Resource List

In September 2021, SickKids will operationalize virtual clinical consultation service for youth and caregivers in the province of Ontario who have questions and/or concerns about COVID-19 vaccination to help address vaccine hesitancy and enhance vaccination uptake.

This will Ensure that youth, caregivers, and legal guardians in Ontario have:

- Equitable access to timely and reliable information about COVID-19 vaccines,
- Question and concerns about COVID-19 vaccines addressed in a safe and judgement-free environment,
- A positive experience, and
- Access to a timely vaccine appointment if they are ready to proceed with vaccination.

While the clinic is being finalized, in the interim, please see the resources below to help guide you in supporting patients and families to receive the COVID-19 Vaccine.
