- 4. Have students paste the steps in the correct order onto the blank Response page, including the step number, instruction, description (grades 6-8) and image for each step.


Step 1	Do not touch	If you see a sharp on the ground at school, in the park or anywhere else do not touch it. It may hurt you and can carry germs.


